Performance and/or Design Requirements (e.g... intended use, function or application, compatibility, requirements; reference to policy, rule, statute or other act of the Legislature, etc., as appropriate): The Department's Pharmacy Services currently utilizes Correctional Institution Pharmacy Systems (CIPS), which is a complete pharmacy software system, designed specifically to optimize the pharmacy of a correctional institution, and provide fast, efficient prescription filling. CIPS is designed to interface with Jail Management Systems containing inmate demographic information, automatically updating the inmate pharmacy records regarding inmate movement, intake, and release. CIPS can also automatically discontinue current, active prescriptions upon inmate release.

Justification for single source acquisition (what is necessary and unique about the product, service or source; steps taken to confirm unavailability of competition, as appropriate):

The Vendor Kalos, Inc. provides the Department with the current software and maintenance embedded in the Department dispensing pharmacies and in every main facility. The Pharmacy staff and Health Care Vendors are currently trained on this software with over ten (10) years' experience. To change the pharmacy software will require enormous training at the dispensing pharmacy along with the Health Care Vendor staff. This would lead to additional training requirements, new system knowledge requirements, which may lead to delayed patient care and service due to delayed prescriptions service. Also, all prescription history, patient profiles, etc., may not transfer or load into the new system. To replace the system, it would delay health services that could become detrimental to a patient's health and would increase cost to the Department.
