The information requested is pursuant to 2 CFR and the federal awarding agency statutory authority.

II. Federal Financial Assistance Funding Opportunity Description

The purpose of the equipment assistance grant is to address the infrastructure needs of eligible School Food Authorities (SFAs) in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). These funds will be awarded through a competitive grant process to SFAs for the purchase of equipment to improve food safety, serve healthier school meals with emphasis on more fruits and vegetables, improve overall energy efficiency, and expand participation. Equipment requests may include new equipment, renovation of equipment, or replacement of equipment.

III. <u>Eligibility Information</u>

Qualified applicants are SFAs that participate in the NSLP. Priority will be given to high need schools (i.e., schools in underserved areas, schools with limited access to other resources, and age of food service equipment) where 50 percent or more of the enrolled students are eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

SFAs that did not receive a previous NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant will have priority of this funding opportunity.

Only one application is allowed per sponsor.

The scope of work must be performed within the state of Florida.

Applicants awarded a 2019 USDA NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant in the 1st round of this Request for Applications ending June 17, 2019, need not apply.

Acquisition Cost: The cost of the asset including the cost to ready the asset for its intended use.

Allowable Expense: Allowable costs are determined in accordance with cost principles of federal regulation 2 CFR Part 200. All expenditures must be adequately documented and must be determined in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (i.e. Using these grant funds to purchase a walk-in freezer for school food service, or a salad bar, may be an allowable cost; building an extension to a cafeteria would be a capital expense that should be borne by the school district).

Applicant: Entity that submits an application for federal financial assistance under this Notice of Federal Financial Assistant Funding Opportunity.

XXI. <u>Evaluator(s)</u>

FDACS' evaluator(s) will consist of 4 individuals who FDACS determines have experience and knowledge in the program areas. The evaluator(s) will conduct a fair, impartial, and comprehensive evaluation of applications received in response to this Notice of Federal Financial Assistance Funding Opportunity.

XXII. Anticipated Announcement and Award Dates

The evaluation and selection process is expected to be no longer than 45 days after the submission deadline. The announcement of the awards will be within 50 days after the submission deadline.

XXIII. <u>Award Notice</u>

Upon the completion of FDACS' evaluation of applications, all applicants will be notified regarding their status.

FDACS reserves the right to negotiate and/or adjust the final award amount and scope of work prior to award.

The successful applicants will have thirty (30) days to fully execute the Subrecipient Agreement. Failure by the subrecipient to sign and return the Subrecipient Agreement, within 30 days upon receipt of the agreement, shall constitute forfeiture of the award.

Although it is the intent of FDACS to expedite the subrecipient grant award process as much as possible, applicants should be aware that execution of a Subrecipient Agreement could be delayed for some time until federal funding is received. Projects should be scheduled accordingly. No costs to be charged against the subrecipient award or counted as match can be incurred before the Subrecipient Agreement is executed.

XXIV. Programmatic, Administrative and National Policy Requirements

The applicant shall be in compliance with all laws, rules, and regulations applicable to the federal funds provided by the Federal Financial Assistance Funding Opportunity.

All reimbursement requests must be submitted using the 2019 NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant – Request for Reimbursement form **(ATTACHMENT B)**, unless otherwise noted in the special conditions of the subrecipient agreement and provide supporting documentation for each cost. The subrecipient shall submit the payment request packet to the recipient's grant manager not more often than monthly, but not less often than quarterly. To be eligible for reimbursement, costs shall be allowable, necessary, and reasonable, and must be submitted by budget category consistent with the budget plan submitted with applicant's application.

<u>The FDACS agreement with the federal agency is a cost reimbursement format; therefore,</u> <u>no advance payments will be provided</u>.

Any work performed on the project and/or any expenditure made prior to a fully executed subrecipient agreement and written authorization from FDACS is ineligible for reimbursement.
