BEGIN ADDENDUM

QUESTION #1

Are there any hunts that may interrupt this project? If so, what are their dates?

ANSWER #1

Yes. FWC has special opportunity hunts on October 12-18, October 26- November 1, November 14-17. Wild turkey special opportunity hunts are on March 21-27, April 4-10, and April 18-24. No work would be allowed on those dates.

QUESTION #2

Can the workers camp on site?

ANSWER #2

Triple N only allows camping during hunting seasons. The Contractor could camp during small game season (11/23-1/19). FWC would strictly enforce this policy, meaning the Contractor could only camp there during that time.

QUESTION #3

Do Contractors need to prequalify with FWC prior to bidding?

ANSWER #3

If the Contractor's bid price is \$200,000 or higher, then the Contractor must pre-quality with the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission, per section B-1, Prequalification to Submit a Bid, of the General Terms and Conditions.
