Question 1	How many teams does FDOT plan on shortlisting?

Question 4	<i>Page 4 of Exhibit A Financial Advisor Services Scope of Services, states that "a consultant <u>actively engaged</u> in providing financial advisor services for other government entities in Florida must identify each client relationship on the attached Government Client List Form." On page 5, the instructions on the Government Client List Form ask to "list all governmental entities for which your firm (as a primary or sub-contractor) has provided services in the last 10 years. Florida entities should be listed first." Should we list only current (<u>actively engaged</u>) entities <u>or all</u> governmental entities?</i>
