QUESTION #1

In reference to Tab E, are you saying all aircraft must be 135, even 137 aircraft? Please clarify.

ANSWER #1

As stated in the RFP, the initial four helicopters must have 133, 135, and 137 certifications. Additional helicopters will be allowed that have only 133 & 137, but each project will have one of the initial four helicopters approved in this RFP with 133, 135, and 137 presented at all times. The additional helicopter(s) may be rented, but not subcontracted.

QUESTION #2

Is there a current contract for Aerial Services?

ANSWER #2

No, there is not currently. The six-month extension on Contract12/13-04 was expired as of January 29, 2019.

QUESTION #3

In reference to page 50, Attachment E, Cost Sheet, Spot Spraying hourly cost:

Will any consideration be given by FWC for the type of aircraft proposed by the vendor for spot spraying?

ANSWER#3

As stated in the RFP, the initial four helicopters must have 133, 135, and 137 certifications. The type of aircraft must adhere to the requested certifications for the initial helicopters if it is the only aircraft on a project. The specific type is up to the vendor to provide. The FWC is not opposed to various types.

QUESTION #4

Can FWC provide an estimate of acres previously treated per year by FWC using Spot Spraying?
