Please be advised that the changes below are applicable to the original specifications of the above referenced solicitation. Added or new language to the RFP is highlighted in **yellow**, while deleted language has been struck.

This Addendum includes the Department's answers to written questions received.

Change No. 1

Attachment I, Section 2.1, Qualifications, is hereby revised as follows:

2.1 Qualifications

- 2.1.1** The entire fence intrusion detection system (including all components) described in this section shall be provided by a single manufacturer, or authorized distributor, and all equipment shall be certified by this source as a fully compatible system.
- 2.1.2** The equipment provided under any resulting Contract shall be equipment that has been successfully provided, utilized, and tested in a detention environment for at least five (5) years.
- 2.1.3** The Vendor shall be certified by the manufacturer for each type of equipment and for this type of installation. Certification in the form of a letter from the manufacturer shall be provided to the Department.
- 2.1.4** The Vendor shall be a certified Electrical Contractor, Alarm System Contractor, or Electrical Specialty Contractor (Limited Energy Specialty), as required in Chapter 489 (Part II), F.S., and certification shall be provided upon request.
- 2.1.5** The Vendor shall have at least one (1) year of business/corporate experience within the last three (3) years, relevant in the provision of perimeter security in a correctional or law enforcement environment.

Change No. 2

Attachment I, Section 2.6.6.9, Warranty Period for NLEF, is hereby revised as follows:

- 2.6.6.9** Warranty Period for NLEF: A date of acceptance shall be established at the final inspection and a warranty period for labor of five (5) years from that date shall begin. The warranty shall cover the installation against all defects in material and workmanship. The warranty shall cover the installation against all damage due to lightning.

The Vendor shall provide a five (5) year warranty on installation and electronic equipment, and a ~~40~~ **five (5)** year warranty on all fence mounted equipment and non-electronic parts, including but not limited to: all wiring, connectors, insulators and terminators, communications wiring, and components regardless of manufacturer. The Vendor shall provide written assurance to the Department that they shall make any and all needed repairs during that period. The warranty shall cover lightning damage.

Change No. 3

Attachment I, Section 2.8, Performance Measures and Financial Consequences, is hereby revised as follows:

2.8 . Performance Measures and Financial Consequences

Installation shall begin after shop drawings are approved by the Department's **Contract Manager, or designee**, subsequent to the issuance of each PO. **Any delay(s) shall be documented upon each occurrence, with a justification provided to the Department's Contract Manager, or designee. If the delay is unavoidable, then the Vendor shall furnish supporting documentation (weather reports, radar images, security delays, etc.), and the Department's Contract Manager, or designee, may consider the documentation received, and the justification for delay, when determining whether a Financial Consequence shall be assessed. Delays resulting from occurrences described in Section 4.23, Force Majeure, will not be assessed a Financial Consequence.**

Change No. 4

Section 4.23 is hereby added:

4.23 Force Majeure

Neither party shall be liable to the other for loss or damage suffered as a result of any delay or failure to perform resulting directly, or indirectly from conditions that are beyond the reasonable control of the other party, and do not involve the intentional misconduct or negligence of that party. Such conditions include, but are not limited to, acts of God, fire, explosions, earthquakes, floods, water, wind, lightning, civil or military authority, acts of public enemy, war, riots, civil disturbances, insurrections, strikes, or labor disputes.

Change No. 5

A change to revise the discount for parts and accessories on Attachment II, Cost Information Sheet.
