 - (6) Make a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of this section.

9) **QUALIFICATIONS**

9.1 General

The Department will determine whether the Proposer is qualified to perform the services being contracted based upon their proposal demonstrating satisfactory experience and capability in the work area. 9.2 Qualifications of Key Personnel

Those individuals who will be directly involved in the project should have demonstrated experience in the areas delineated in the scope of work. Individuals whose qualifications are presented will be committed to the project for its duration unless otherwise excepted by the Department's Project Manager. Where State of Florida registration or certification is deemed appropriate, a copy of the registration or certificate should be included in the proposal package.

9.3 Authorized To Do Business in the State of Florida

10) WARRANTY/SUBSTITUTIONS

When performance of the services requires the supply of commodities, a warranty is required on all items provided against defective materials, workmanship, and failure to perform in accordance with required industry performance criteria, for a period of not less than ninety (90) days from the date of acceptance by the purchaser. Any deviation from this criteria must be documented in the proposal response or the above statement shall prevail. Delivery of substitute commodities requires prior written approval from the ordering location.

Replacement of all materials found defective within the warranty period shall be made without cost to the purchaser, including transportation if applicable. All fees associated with restocking cancelled orders shall be the responsibility of the vendor.

All items provided during the performance of the contract found to be poorly manufactured will not be

accepted, but returned to the vendor, at their expense, for replacement. Replacement of all items found defective shall be made without cost to the Department, including transportation, if applicable. As it may be impossible for each facility to inspect all items upon arrival, a reasonable opportunity must be given to these facilities for inspection of the items, and returning those that are defective.

This contract will only be issued to a State of Florida Governmental Agency or Educational Unit as defined in Chapter 120, Florida Statutes.

15) REVIEW OF PROPOSER'S FACILITIES & QUALIFICATIONS

After the proposal due date and prior to contract execution, the Department reserves the right to perform or have performed an on-site review of the Proposer's facilities and qualifications. This review will serve to verify data and representations submitted by the Proposer and may be used to determine whether the Proposer has an adequate, qualified, and experienced staff, and can provide overall management facilities. The review may also serve to verify whether the Proposer has financial capability adequate to meet the contract requirements.

Should the Department determine that the proposal has material misrepresentations or that the size or nature of the Proposer's facilities or the number of experienced personnel (including technical staff) are not adequate to ensure satisfactory contract performance, the Department has the right to reject the proposal.

17) UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS

No conditions may be applied to any aspect of the RFP by the proposer. 21.2 Multiple Proposals

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Proposer shall provide a management plan which describes administration, management and key personnel.

a. Administration and Management

The Proposer's plan should be realistic, leverage existing capabilities for greater effectiveness or efficiency and responsibilities of personnel should be well defined and appropriately assigned.

b. Qualifications, Capabilities & Experience of Staff

Developing Safety Performance Function (SPF) and Crash Modification Factor (CMF) for Managed Lanes Separation Treatments

Background Statement

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) implements managed lanes to provide congestion relief. Managed lanes are a transportation systems management and operations solution (TSM&O) for highway facilities or lanes where operational strategies are proactively implemented and managed in response to changing traffic conditions. The three primary operational strategies are vehicle eligibility, separation and access control, and congestion pricing. The managed lanes are considered express Lanes when congestion pricing is used. Managed lanes are typically physically separated from a general use lane within a roadway corridor. In Florida, most managed lanes that are in operation are express lanes. These lanes use variable pricing through electronic tolling based on existing traffic conditions. Some of the major benefits of travel lanes include predictable travel time, congestion relief, reductions in fuel consumption and air pollution, and increased transit use.

In some cases, managed lanes are reversible, typically operating in one direction for the morning peak period and in the other direction during the evening peak period. The toll is collected through electronic toll collection systems. The toll amount is adjusted in response to the traffic demand in the express lanes, with the goal of providing a minimum traffic speed and level of service.

FDOT's managed lanes network contains 80 miles spreading across Interstates I-95, I-75, I-295, I-595, and the Palmetto Expressway. Among these highways, I-595 is a reversible lane facility.

There are five common managed lanes separation types:

- a) Barrier separation
- b) Buffer separation with managed lane markers
- c) Buffer separation with pavement marking
- d) Wide buffer separation
- e) Grade separation

While it is generally understood that the greater the physical and/or spatial separation, the better the operating and safety performance of both the managed lanes and the general use lanes, it is unclear how the performance varies among separation types. The separation technique is one of the critical design decisions that influence the feasibility, operations, and constructability of a managed lane project, and it is therefore important to better understand the performance of the various separation treatments.




Figure 1: Managed Lanes Barrier Separation Typical Section

Barrier separation involves separating the managed lanes from the general use lanes using a rigid barrier such as a concrete barrier. Shoulders are provided on both sides of the barrier. Some of the key benefits include elimination of access violations, improved traffic management, improved safety, and better access control, however this type of barrier typically has a higher cost and larger right-of-way impact. Figure 1 shows a typical cross section with barrier separation.




Figure 2: Managed Lanes Buffer Separation with Managed Lanes Marker Typical Section

Buffer separation, shown in Figure 2, involves the use of double solid white painted striping, and may also include managed lane markers spaced at 5 feet to inhibit ingress and egress of vehicles in between the predefined locations. These markers provide visual separation between managed lanes and general use lanes as well as help in maintaining lane positions. As specified in FDOT Design Manual, a minimum buffer of 4 feet should be provided between managed lanes and general use lanes, with managed lane markers placed at the center of the buffer.




Figure 3: Managed Lanes Wide Buffer Separation Typical Section

Wide buffer separation, shown in Figure 3, may include a grassed median or pavement. Paved wide buffers should be no more than 12 feet wide.




Figure 4: Managed Lanes Grade Separation Typical Section

Grade Separation, shown in Figure 4, uses a structure to separate the managed lanes from the general use lanes. This separation type effectively creates two separate roadways, and may be analyzed using existing HSM methodologies.

The Highway Safety Manual (HSM) provides a methodology to predict crashes and quantify the safety benefits of various design features on different highway types. NCHRP 17-45 developed crash predictive models for freeways, which are included in the HSM Supplement. Enhanced Interchange Safety Analysis Tool (ISATe) was also developed under NCHRP 17-45 to support the implementation of the freeway crash predictive models, excluding freeway facilities. NCHRP Project 17-45 produced a set of safety prediction methods for basic freeway facilities.

Project Objectives

The aim of this project is to expand our understanding of the effects of separation type selection on safety performance. This project will collect data from existing managed lane facilities in Florida and develop Safety Performance Functions (SPFs) and Crash Modification Factors (CMFs) for managed lane facilities based on separation type. A SPF will be developed for a managed lane facilities base condition, and CMFs will be developed for variations in separation type. If the data collected supports the development of CMFs for features other than separation type, they may also be included in the research. Possibilities include access type, access frequency, and number of lanes. All separation types listed above should be included in the study, if adequate data does not exist in Florida, data from facilities in other states may be used. The desired outcome of this research is CMFs and SPFs that can be used to quantitatively compare alternatives during project development and design. This research will focus on the four separation types below.

- a) Barrier separation
- b) Buffer separation with managed lane markers
- c) Buffer separation with pavement marking
- d) Wide buffer separation

Supporting Tasks and Deliverables

Project Kickoff Teleconference

The principal investigator will schedule a kickoff meeting that shall be held within the first 30 days of contract execution. The kickoff meeting will consist of a webinar at least 30 minutes in length. The purpose of the meeting is to review the tasks, deliverables, deployment plan, timeline, and expected/anticipated project outcomes and their potential for implementation and benefits. The project manager, principal investigator, and research performance coordinator shall attend. Other parties may be invited, if appropriate.

Task 1: Literature Review

The research team will complete a literature review of the existing practices of managed lane separation in Florida as well as around the country. The literature review should also include a review of relevant research related to safety performance of managed lane facilities. The literature review may guide the researchers in the selection of data to be collected.

Deliverable 1: Upon completion of Task 1, vendor will submit a report detailing the results of the literature review to the Research Center at research.center@dot.state.fl.us.

Task 2: Methodology for Data Collection

The research team will develop a methodology for data collection, analysis, and development of CMFs and SPFs. This task will include data collection such as crash data, roadway geometry, and traffic data, as appropriate. The methodology and data collection should follow techniques consistent with the Highway Safety Manual, Model Inventory of Roadway Elements (MIRE) and other industry standards.

Deliverable 2: Upon completion of Task 2, the vendor will submit a report that describes in detail Data Collection Methodology to the Research Center at research.center@dot.state.fl.us.

Task 3: Data Collection, Data Analysis and Development of SPFs and CMFs

Research team will collect the data in accordance with the approved Data Collection Methodology. Using the data collected, the team will develop SPFs and CMFs (or adjustment factors) for the managed lanes by considering different types of separation treatments, lane widths, and shoulder widths. At a minimum, the team will develop SPFs for 6, 8, and 10 lane sections of facilities that have managed lanes with different separations types and shoulder widths. The research team must develop SPFs and CMFs for sections with statistical significance. The research team performs a sensitivity analysis using the full SPFs to identify the effect of all significant geometric factors on the safety of managed lanes. CMFs or adjustment factors will be developed for all significant variables within each SPF.

Deliverable 3: Upon completion of Task 3, the vendor will submit a report on the Data Collection and Data Analysis to the Research Center at research.center@dot.state.fl.us.

Task 4: Draft Final Report and Closeout Teleconference

Deliverable 4a: Ninety (90) days prior to the end date of the contract, the vendor will submit a draft final report to research.center@dot.state.fl.us

The draft final report will contain the proposed SPFs and CMFs including results of the data analysis, an explanation of the methodology and assumptions used to develop the SPFs and CMFs. The draft final report will include revisions to address and resolve all Department comments and summarize any challenges or limitations encountered during the development of the SPFs and CMFs that could be useful when implementing the results of the research.

The report must be well-written and edited for technical accuracy, grammar, clarity, organization, and format.

SERVICES AND PERFORMANCE

- A In connection with <u>Developing Safety Performance Function and Crash Modification Factor for Managed Lanes Separation Treatments</u>, the Department does hereby retain the Vendor to furnish certain services, information, and items as described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- B. Before making any additions or deletions to the work described in this Agreement, and before undertaking any changes or revisions to such work, the parties shall negotiate any necessary cost changes and shall enter into an Amendment covering such work and compensation. Reference herein to this Agreement shall include any amendment(s).
- C. All tracings, plans, specifications, maps, computer files, and reports prepared or obtained under this Agreement, as well as all data collected, together with summaries and charts derived therefrom, shall be the exclusive property of the Department without restriction or limitation on their use and shall be made available, upon request, to the Department at any time during the performance of such services and/or upon completion or termination of this Agreement. Upon delivery to the Department of said document(s), the Department shall become the custodian thereof in accordance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Vendor shall not copyright any material and products or patent any invention developed under this Agreement. The Department shall have the right to visit the site for inspection of the work and the products of the Vendor at any time.
- D. All final plans, documents, reports, studies, and other data prepared by the Vendor shall bear the professional's seal/signature, in accordance with the applicable Florida Statutes, Administrative Rules promulgated by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, and guidelines published by the Department, in effect at the time of execution of this Agreement. In the event that changes in the statutes or rules create a conflict with the requirements of published guidelines, requirements of the statutes and rules shall take precedence.
- E. The Vendor agrees to provide project schedule progress reports in a format acceptable to the Department and at intervals established by the Department. The Department shall be entitled at all times to be advised, at its request, as to the status of work being done by the Vendor and of the details thereof. Coordination shall be maintained by the Vendor with representatives of the Department, or of other agencies interested in the project on behalf of the Department. Either party to this Agreement may request and be granted a conference.
- F. All services shall be performed by the Vendor to the satisfaction of the Director who shall decide all questions, difficulties, and disputes of any nature whatsoever that may arise under or by reason of this Agreement, the prosecution and fulfillment of the services hereunder and the character, quality, amount of value thereof; and the decision upon all claims, questions, and disputes shall be final and binding upon the parties hereto. Adjustments of compensation and contract time because of any major changes in the work that may become necessary or desirable as the work progresses shall be subject to mutual agreement of the parties, and amendment(s) shall be entered into by the parties in accordance herewith.

2. TERM

A	Initial Term. This Agreement shall begin on date of execution and shall remain in full force and effect through completion of all services required or two year from the date of contract execution, whichever occurs first. Subsequent to the execution of this Agreement by both parties, the services to be rendered by the Vendor shall commence and be completed in accordance with the option selected below. C. EXTENSIONS. In the event that circumstances arise which make performance by the Vendor impracticable or impossible within the time allowed or which prevent a new contract from being executed, the Department, in its discretion, may grant an extension of this Agreement. Extension of this Agreement must be in writing for a period not to exceed six (6) months and is subject to the same terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and any written amendments signed by the parties; provided the Department may, in its discretion, grant a proportional increase in the total dollar amount based on the method and rate established herein. There may be only one extension of this Agreement unless the failure to meet the criteria set forth in this Agreement for completion of this Agreement is due to events beyond the control of the Vendor.

It shall be the responsibility of the Vendor to ensure at all times that sufficient time remains in the Project Schedule within which to complete services on the project. In the event there have been delays which would affect the project completion date, the Vendor shall submit a written request to the Department which identifies the reason(s) for the delay and the amount of time related to each reason. The Department shall review the request and make a determination as to granting all or part of the requested extension.

3. <u>COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT</u>

A Payment shall be made only after receipt and approval of goods and services unless advance payments are authorized by the Chief Financial Officer of the State of Florida under Chapters 215 and 216, Florida Statutes. If the Department determines that the performance of the Vendor is unsatisfactory, the Department shall notify the Vendor of the deficiency to be corrected, which correction shall be made within a time-frame to be specified by the Department. The Vendor shall, within five days after notice from the Department, provide the Department with a corrective action plan describing how the Vendor will address all issues of contract non-performance, unacceptable performance, failure to meet the minimum performance levels, deliverable deficiencies, or contract non-compliance. If the corrective action plan is unacceptable to the Department, the Vendor shall be assessed a non-performance retainage equivalent to 10% of the total invoice amount. The retainage shall be applied to the invoice for the then-current billing period. The retainage shall be withheld until the vendor resolves the deficiency. If the deficiency is subsequently resolved, the Vendor will bill the Department for the

retained amount during the next billing period. If the Vendor is unable to resolve the deficiency, the funds retained will be forfeited at the end of the agreement period.

- B. If this Agreement involves units of deliverables, then such units must be received and accepted in writing by the Contract Manager prior to payments.
- C. Bills for fees or other compensation for services or expenses shall be submitted in detail sufficient for a proper preaudit and postaudit thereof.
- D. The bills for any travel expenses, when authorized by terms of this Agreement and by the Department's Project Manager, shall be submitted in accordance with Section 112.061, Florida Statutes. In addition, if compensation for travel is authorized under this Agreement and by the Department's Project Manager, then the Department shall not compensate the Vendor for lodging/hotel expenses in excess of \$150.00 per day (excluding taxes and fees). The Vendor may expend their own funds to the extent the lodging/hotel expense exceeds \$150.00 per day. The Department, in its sole discretion and pursuant to its internal policies and procedures, may approve compensation to the Vendor for lodging/hotel expenses in excess of \$150.00 per day.
- E. Vendors providing goods and services to the Department should be aware of the following time frames. Upon receipt, the Department has five (5) working days to inspect and approve the goods and services, unless otherwise specified herein. The Department has twenty (20) days to deliver a request for payment (voucher) to the Department of Financial Services. The twenty (20) days are measured from the latter of the date the invoice is received or the goods or services are received, inspected and approved.
- F. If a payment is not available within forty (40) days, a separate interest penalty as established pursuant to Section 215.422, Florida Statutes, shall be due and payable, in addition to the invoice amount, to the Vendor. Interest penalties of less than one (1) dollar shall not be enforced unless the Vendor requests payment. Invoices which have to be returned to a Vendor because of Vendor preparation errors shall result in a delay in the payment. The invoice payment requirements do not start until a properly completed invoice is provided to the Department.
- The State of Florida, through the Department of Management Services, has instituted G. MyFloridaMarketPlace, a statewide eProcurement system. Pursuant to Section 287.057(22), Florida Statutes, all payments shall be assessed a transaction fee of one percent (1%), which the Vendor shall pay to the State. Records of costs incurred shall include the Vendor's general accounting records and the project records, together with supporting documents and records of the Vendor and all subcontractors performing work on the project, and all other records of the Vendor and subcontractors considered necessary by the Department for a proper audit of project costs.

J. The Department, during any fiscal year, shall not expend money, incur any liability, or enter into any contract which, by its terms, involves the expenditure of money in excess of the amounts budgeted as available for expenditure during such fiscal year. Any contract, verbal or written, made in violation of this subsection is null and void, and no money may be paid on such contract. 5. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS</u>

- B. The Vendor agrees that it shall make no statements, press releases or publicity releases concerning this Agreement or its subject matter or otherwise discuss or permit to be disclosed or discussed any of the data or other information obtained or furnished in compliance with this Agreement, or any particulars thereof, during the period of the Agreement, without first notifying the Department's Contract Manager and securing prior written consent. The Vendor also agrees that it shall not publish, copyright, or patent any of the data developed under this Agreement, it being understood that such data or information are works made for hire and the property of the Department.
- C. The Vendor shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work or payment for work thereof, and will not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability in the performance of work under this Agreement.
- D. If the Vendor is licensed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to perform the services herein contracted, then Section 337.162, Florida Statutes, applies as follows:

Solicitations for Subcontractors, including Procurements of Materials and Equipment: In all solicitations made by the Contractor, either by competitive bidding or negotiation for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment; each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the Contractor of the Contractor's obligations under this contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, religion or family status.
- F. Information and Reports: The Contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Florida Department of Transportation, the Federal Highway Administration, Federal Transit Administration, Federal Aviation Administration, and/or the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders and instructions. - G. - H. It is mutually understood and agreed that the willful falsification, distortion or misrepresentation with respect to any facts related to the project(s) described in this Agreement is a violation of the Federal Law. Accordingly, United States Code, Title 18, Section 1020, is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
- N. It is understood and agreed that if the Contractor at any time learns that the certification it provided the Department in compliance with 49 CFR, Section 26.51, was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances, the Contractor shall provide immediate written notice to the Department. It is further agreed that the clause titled "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion Lower Tier Covered Transaction" as set forth in 49 CFR, Section 29.510, shall be included by the Contractor in all lower tier covered transactions and in all aforementioned federal regulation.
- O. The Department hereby certifies that neither the Contractor nor the Contractor's representative has been required by the Department, directly or indirectly as an express or implied condition in connection with obtaining or carrying out this contract, to
 - 1. employ or retain, or agree to employ or retain, any firm or person, or
 - pay, or agree to pay, to any firm, person, or organization, any fee, contribution, donation, or consideration of any kind;

The Department further acknowledges that this agreement will be furnished to a federal agency, in connection with this contract involving participation of Federal-Aid funds, and is subject to applicable State and Federal Laws, both criminal and civil.

- P. The Contractor hereby certifies that it has not:
 - employed or retained for a commission, percentage, brokerage, contingent fee, or other consideration, any firm or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for me or the above contractor) to solicit or secure this contract:
 - 2. agreed, as an express or implied condition for obtaining this contract, to employ or retain the services of any firm or person in connection with carrying out this contract; or
 - 3. paid, or agreed to pay, to any firm, organization or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for me or the above contractor) any fee contribution, donation, or consideration of any kind for, or in

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connection with, procuring or carrying out the contract.

The Contractor further acknowledges that this agreement will be furnished to the State of Florida Department of Transportation and a federal agency in connection with this contract involving participation of Federal-Aid funds, and is subject to applicable State and Federal Laws, both criminal and civil.

- Q. Federal-aid projects for highway construction shall comply with the Buy America provisions of 23 CFR 635.410, as amended.
- R. Except as otherwise provided under 41 CFR Part 60, all contracts that meet the definition of federally assisted construction contract" in 41 CFR Part 60-1.3 shall comply with the equal opportunity clause provided under 41 CFR 60-1.4(b), in accordance with Executive Order 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity" (30 FR 12319, 12935, 3 CFR Part, 1964-1965 Comp., p. 339), as amended by Executive Order 11375, "Amending Executive Order 11246 Relating to Equal Employment Opportunity," and implementing regulations at 41 CFR part 60, "Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor."
