ADDENDUM NO. 4

Item #1: Questions and Answers

- Question #1: Are contractors allowed to be present at all of the testing times and allowed to examine conditions at all stages of testing during the University of Florida's on water test of the different contractors shredders?
- Answer #1: Respondents may exam the test site prior to the start of testing by the University of Florida but may not be present during the University of Florida's testing of other respondent's machines.
- Question #2: Is it okay that one of my references are listed as a proposed panel member?
- Answer #2: References can be individuals who are evaluators for the responses to this RFP. References <u>cannot</u> be individuals who will be performing efficiency testing for the University of Florida.
- Question #3: One of our shredders is working on a project near Sacramento, California and we do not know when the job will be completed. We have an identical sister shredder to the one in California in Lake Wales, Florida that we plan on taking to the University of Florida shredder demonstration, no problem. What will it take to qualify the shredder in California for this contract? The California shredder is an exact copy of the one we will be ready to test for this Proposal. Both machines were fabricated at the same time and the Vin Numbers are one number apart.
- Answer #3: Testing of the machine from Lake Wales will qualify the shredder in California for use under this RFP as long as they are identical and of the same class of shredder. Machines which are not identical and of the same class must each be tested to qualify for use.
