The Florida Department of Children and Families, having received less than two responsive sealed proposals, states its intent to withdraw RFP052019DB1. Pursuant to section 287.057(5), Florida Statutes, this is the final posting by the Department on the DMS Vendor Bid System regarding this RFP.

The Department also states its intent to proceed with the purchase of these services pursuant to section 287.057(5), Florida Statutes, in lieu of re-soliciting competitive sealed proposals.

This is not a selection under RFP052019DB1, which is withdrawn by this notice. This is a notice of an exceptional purchase after receipt of less than two responsive proposals, per section 287.057(5), Florida Statutes. This purchase is excepted by law from the requirements for competitive procurement.
