UPDATE: QUESTION AND ANSWERS (ITEMS #1)

The enclosed addendum has been issued for consideration in the preparation of your response to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FWC) Solicitation No. FWC 17/18-92 — Whole Tree Chipping Project. All responses to the subject solicitation must be received no later than: 3:00 P.M. (ET) on March 2nd, 2018. A response received after the exact time specified will not be considered. Failure to file a protest within the time prescribed in Section 120.57(3), Florida Statutes, or failure to post the bond or other security required by law within the time allowed for filing a bond shall constitute a waiver of proceedings under Chapter 120, Florida Statutes (F.S.). Written notices, formal requests and proceedings must conform with the requirements set forth in Chapter 28-110, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). Protests must be filed with the Purchasing Office, Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Suite 100, 2590 Executive Center Circle, Tallahassee, Florida 32301 within the time prescribed in Section 120.57(3), Florida Statutes and Chapter 28-110, Florida Administrative Code.

ITEM #1 Question and Answers:

- Question #1: Are there any other acceptable methods for chipping/grinding? (For example: Forestry Mulching with a knife head such as Denis Cimaf)
- Answer #1: A Denis Cimaf or equivalent is acceptable as long as the objective of reducing the piles to wood chips is achieved.
- Question #2: Are we responsible for further rutting to the trail due to soft underfoot conditions?
- Answer #2: You are not responsible for the condition of the trail following the completion of the project except as it pertains to the disposition of the wood chips which is specified in the scope of work.
- Question #3: If there are no other methods accepted for chipping/grinding, what is to be done with the root balls and the material with excessive dirt in it?
- Answer #3: Since alternative methods for chipping/grinding are acceptable (see question 1), this question is moot.
