Question 9) What are the criteria for awarding the contract? Answer 9) Please see the ITB, Page 11, 4.11, "Basis of Award"

Question 10) On page 39 items # 4 - "Health Insurance" - can we provide an added hourly rate to wages instead of health insurance? The current Federal wage allowance for health benefits is an additional \$3.71 per hour if a company does not provide health insurance to its employees. Answer 10) No

Question 11) If the answer is yes, what is the hourly rate you require? Answer 11) The answer was No

Question 12) This is a follow up to the question I had on health insurance. This is the first time I've seen the requirement for health insurance without the option of an additional hourly rate in lieu of health insurance. Can't you revise the bid specs to include an alternative additional hourly rate in lieu of health insurance? Virtually all "living wage" and "wage determination" clauses include the option for an employer to provide an additional hourly rate in place of health insurance.

Question 13) Right now there are 8 day porters. Can you please clarify how to include the cost of day porters in the bid?

Answer 13) There are 7-day porters currently their cost is in the Optional Work hours. Hourly rate.

Question 14) Are day porters a separate billing and not to be included in the bid?

Answer 14) The Day Porters are billed separately at an hourly rate and are included in the BID.

Question 15) If day porters are not included in the bid, when does DOH negotiate for this service? Is this service then added to the contract or is a new contract drafted?

Answer 15) See Question 13 and Question 14.

Question 16) How long has the current service provider had the contract? Answer 16) Started February 1, 2012

Question 17) How do we fill in optional work portion of Price guide? It doesn't make sense; do you want a price for 40,000 labor hours in terms of a square foot price and then multiply by twelve to get the annual price?

Answer 17) The 40,000 hours is a typographical error. The estimated amount should be 20,000 hours. 20,000 hours estimated maximum hours per year of optional work x vendor's hourly rate for day porters. An Addendum will be released later with a revised Bid Price Page.

Question 18) The bid specs call for on-site supervisory presence. Is that cost to be added into optional work portion of price page or is it part of routine work part of price page?

Answer 18) Part of monthly Routine Work Costs.

Question 19) DOH personnel said that every location is to be cleaned every night. However, Pahokee/Glades Health Center is open only 2 times per week. Do we still send a cleaner 5 days per week or just 2 days per week? The same question goes for any other location not open 5 days per week.

Answer 19) Clean at night only on days they are open.

Question 20) Major portions of the vct flooring at the West Palm Beach Health Center have been damaged along the walls. For example, many sections of the baseboard have been kicked under the sheet rock and seem to require construction repair work and are really beyond the scope of what a janitorial company does. What liability will the new cleaning company have to correct these problems?
