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PROCEEDINGS

(Agenda items commenced at 9:15 a.m.)

THE COURT: We have two appointments before us requiring Cabinet approval. General Bob Milligan, as interim director of the Department of Veterans Affairs. As you know, Admiral LeRoy Collins passed away unexpectedly several weeks ago. And this sad event has required us to select an interim executive director to lead this important agency.

I would like to recognize and thank the Department's chief of staff, Earl Daniell, for stepping in during this difficult time and overseeing the responsibilities of the Department. We are fortunate that General Bob Milligan has once again agreed to leave private life and serve the people of Florida.

In 2007 we called on him to lead the State
Board of Administration, and now he has agreed to
return to public service as the interim executive
director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs. Is
there a motion to approve my appointment of General
Bob Milligan?

ATTORNEY GENERAL McCOLLUM: So moved.

COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Second.

THE COURT: Moved and seconded. Show it approved without objection. General, would you like to please say a few words?

MR. MILLIGAN: Thank you, Governor and Cabinet. Admiral LeRoy Collins was a good friend of mine. In fact, we were classmates at the Naval Academy, started together, have known him since 1952. But large shoes to fill. But he did build a really excellent staff. And I hope that my leadership will be able to maintain the quality that he set. So thank you, and I won't let you down.

THE COURT: Thank you, General. Appreciate your service.

(Applause)

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GOVERNOR CRIST: Next I would like to ask the Cabinet to confirm my appointment of Mimi Drew as interim secretary of the Department of Environmental Protection, effective September the 10th. Ms. Drew has earned — served, rather, as the agency's deputy secretary of Regulatory Programs since 2007 and previously as director of the Division of Water Resource Management since January of 1995, with more than 30 years of technical, supervisory and administrative experience with Florida environmental issues.

She received a bachelor's degree from the University of Florida, as well as a master's degree in environmental engineering and sciences.

Is there a motion to approve Mimi Drew as interim secretary of the Department?

CFO SINK: I move.

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COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Second.

GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it approved without objection. Mimi, we'd love to hear from you.

MS. DREW: Thank you very much, Governor, members of the Cabinet. First of all, I have to say we're going to miss Mike Sole. I know that you-all recognized him at your last meeting, and he's truly a leader in the agency who many, many people are going to miss him. That's all I can say. He's a man of the people. He got around to the districts, to the divisions, to the parks, and everybody knows him. So he will be a hard act to follow.

Secondly, I'd like to tell you that I really appreciate the opportunity. This is the culmination of a long career in public service, and I can't imagine a greater honor or privilege than being asked by you to take this job. So thank you very much, Governor and members of the Cabinet, and I

WATKINS: Good morning, Governor, Cabinet 4 Item Number 1 is approval of the minutes 5 of the August 10th meeting. GOVERNOR CRIST: Is there a motion? 6 7 COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Motion for approval. 8 ATTORNEY GENERAL McCOLLUM: Second. 9 GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show them 10 approved without objection. 11 MR. WATKINS: Item Number 2 is a resolution 12 authorizing the issuance and competitive sale of up 13 to \$71 million in refunding bonds for the facilities 14 management program administered by the Department of 15 Management Services. 16 ATTORNEY GENERAL McCOLLUM: I move Item 2. 17 COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Second. 18 GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it 19 approved without objection. 20 MR. WATKINS: Item Number 3 are resolutions 2.1 authorizing the issuance and competitive sale of up 22 to \$72 million in refunding bonds for the State 23 University System. 24 COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Motion for approval of Item 3. 25

1 CFO SINK: Second. 2 GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it 3 approved without objection. 4 MR. WATKINS: Item Number 4 is a report of 5 award of the competitive sale of \$109,750,000 in 6 Lottery Revenue Refunding Bonds. The bonds were 7 awarded to the low bidder at a true interest cost 8 rate of approximately 1.88 percent, and the 9 transaction generated gross debt service savings of 10 approximately \$16.9 million or \$15.6 million on a 11 present value basis. 12 ATTORNEY GENERAL McCOLLUM: Move Item 4. 13 COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Second. 14 GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it 15 approved without objection. 16 CFO SINK: Governor, I just want to point out, 17 1.88 percent, have you ever seen interest rates this 18 low? 19 MR. WATKINS: No, ma'am. 20 CFO SINK: Let's go do more. I know we're 2.1 working on that, right? 22 MR. WATKINS: That's exactly right. 23 see from the complexion of the agenda today, rates 24 are -- the interest rate environment is 25 extraordinarily favorable. And so we're moving

aggressively to take advantage of the opportunities that the market offers to save the State money. Lastly, Item 5 is adoption of a resolution authorizing the issuance and competitive sale of up to \$540 million in Lottery Revenue Refunding Bonds. ATTORNEY GENERAL McCOLLUM: Move Item 5. CFO SINK: Second. GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it approved without objection. Thank you, Ben. MR. WATKINS: Thank you very much.

GOVERNOR CRIST: Office of Financial Regulation, Commissioner Tom Cardwell. Morning, Tom.

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MR. CARDWELL: Good morning, Governor Crist, members of the Cabinet. Two brief items today. We're requesting approval for final adoption of rules. These are largely cleanup, clarification rules. The first request is amendments to Rule 69W-100, 200, 300, 301 and 500, which relate to our securities regulation. They update changes and references to federal statutes and repeal some unnecessary rules and make changes to clarify and simplify our regulations.

GOVERNOR CRIST: Is there a motion on Item 1?

COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Motion for adoption of Item 1.

CFO SINK: Second.

GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it approved without objection.

MR. CARDWELL: And Item Number 2 is we request approval for final adoption for rules relating to Chapter 69V-40, which are relating to mortgage brokering and lending. These are the proposed rules which implement the S.A.F.E. Act that we've been discussing for a period of time. These are the

1	final rules doing that. We've had lots of input on
2	them, and they are ready for final adoption.

4	COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Second.
5	GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it
6	approved without objection. Thank you, sir.
7	MR. CARDWELL: Thank you.
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1 GOVERNOR CRIST: Agency for Enterprise 2 Information Technology, David Taylor. 3 MR. TAYLOR: Governor and Cabinet, good 4 morning. 5 ATTORNEY GENERAL McCOLLUM: Good morning. 6 MR. TAYLOR: Item Number 1 today, I would like 7 to respectfully request the approval of the minutes 8 for June 8th, 2010, meeting of the Governor and 9 Cabinet. 10 CFO SINK: Move it. 11 COMMISSIONER BRONSON: Second. 12 ATTORNEY GENERAL McCOLLUM: Second. 13 GOVERNOR CRIST: Moved and seconded. Show it 14 approved without objection. 15 MR. TAYLOR: The second item is AEIT is 16 requesting approval of its 2010-2011 Operational 17 Work Plan. On August 25th, 2009, we received 18 approval for our last year's 2009-2010 Operational 19 Work Plan. And I'm pleased to inform you that we 20 met all the deadlines and deliverables outlined in 2.1 that plan. By the end of this week you'll receive 22 the Agency's annual report, which will detail all of 23 those accomplishments. 24 The new Operational Work Plan is very much like

the last Operational Work Plan and includes two

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major changes. The first major change is that the legislature has asked the AEIT to move forward on an enterprise e-mail system. The task involved there will be to develop a procurement document and a business plan for the statewide e-mail system based on the outcome of a competitive solicitation.

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We're also required to develop an implementation plan and a schedule for implementation for e-mail migration of the executive branch. We're also to develop administrative rule for that service.

The second new item involves purchasing and procurement responsibilities. We're to work with the Department of Management Services, Division of Purchasing, to establish best practices for the procurement of IT products and services. We're also to coordinate procurement negotiations for IT products that will be used by multiple agencies in the executive branch.

We're also to develop standards for Enterprise
Information Technology services and to provide
recommendations to the legislature for consolidating
the purchases of IT commodities and services.

On July 19th AEIT presented this Operational Work Plan to the Chief Information Officers Council

1	and posted it on the Agency's website for comment.
2	The plan was endorsed without objection.
3	I respectfully request approval of this plan by
4	you, the Governor and Cabinet.

officers. Rule two provides for a mandatory

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training attendance requirement for county veteran 1 service officers. 2 3 And rule three provides for sanctions to educational institutions found noncompliant with 4 5 federal VA requirements for participation in veteran 6 education programs.
