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PROCEEDINGS

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GOVERNOR SCOTT: First off, thanks everybody for doing this. Good afternoon to everybody.

Thanks for being available today. As you know, I have nominated Mike Prendergast.

And, by the way, before we — we all ought to be celebrating. If you saw, the unemployment numbers dropped for the fifth straight month, and we generated more jobs last month, 28,000, than the rest of the country put together. The rest of the country only did 26,000. We did 28— by ourselves in Florida. So what we're — the four of us are doing is — we're doing the right things.

ATTORNEY GENERAL BONDI: Thanks for all your hard work, Governor.

GOVERNOR SCOTT: As you know, I have nominated Mike Prendergast to be the executive director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs. Mike retired from the United States Navy (sic) as a colonel, after 31 years of honorable service. I always give him trouble that it must have been hard to get into the Navy at that point in time. The Army is a good second choice.

His active duty included multiple combat

deployments in Iraq and Afghanistan, as well as assignments in Africa, Europe and Asia, where he served in leadership positions.

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His education includes master's degrees in international relations, public administration and strategic studies.

Just as our veterans have given us their best, we need to do the same for them. I am confident that Mike is the best person to lead this agency and advocate on behalf of our veterans.

Is there a motion to confirm my appointment of Mike Prendergast as the executive director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs at his current salary?

COMMISSIONER PUTNAM: Governor, this is

Commissioner Putnam. And I can't think of a better

fighter for our returning men and women coming home

to Florida. And with our strong military presence

in this state, we have more than our fair share of

veterans coming back home to Florida. And Mike is

going to be the leader to be there for them and make

sure that they're able to avail themselves of all

the benefits that they have so richly earned and

sacrificed so much to receive.

So I move that Mike Prendergast be the

executive director of the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs.

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GOVERNOR SCOTT: Thank you, Commissioner. Is there a second?

ATTORNEY GENERAL BONDI: Governor, I strongly second that motion. I know Colonel Prendergast from Tampa. And, Governor, I can assure the entire state no one has higher ethics than Colonel Prendergast, and I think we would all be very well served to have him in that position, and I thank him for his service to our state and our country.

GOVERNOR SCOTT: Thank you very much.

CFO ATWATER: Governor.

GOVERNOR SCOTT: Go ahead.

CFO ATWATER: I guess I could — any chance I could third —

GOVERNOR SCOTT: Absolutely.

CFO ATWATER: — the motion? I have known the colonel, and we are — Florida is very fortunate that he is willing to say yes to this opportunity to serve us in this capacity and serve our veterans. We are actually very, very fortunate. So the big winner today, though I'm sure he is grateful, is the people of Florida and our veterans. So I'm happy to third the nomination.

GOVERNOR SCOTT: Thank you very much, CFO

Atwater. So all in favor, I guess we don't have to
say aye since we all did that. Any opposed?

(No response)

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GOVERNOR SCOTT: The motion is approved by unanimous consent, or unanimous vote.

Congratulations, Mike. Effective immediately you are the new executive director of Veterans' Affairs.

Would you like to say a few words?

MR. PRENDERGAST: Yes, Governor, I would.

Thank you very much. Before I begin my comments,

I'd like to thank our great firefighters from our

Division of Forestry here in the state of Florida.

We lost two brave men today, or this week, I'm

sorry, who were fighting valiantly to protect life

and property. And it's an unfortunate circumstance

that these brave men did die while they were in the

line of duty supporting our state.

It is a very dangerous time right now across our state, Commissioner Putnam. And we cannot do enough to thank those brave men and women who help protect us when wildfires hit our state. And it's going to be — until we get some more rainfall, it's going to continue to plague our state with some challenges. So my — on behalf of my wife and I and

our family, our hearts do go out to those firefighters' families, and I thank them for their brave service to the state.

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Governor Scott, General Bondi, Commissioner
Putnam and CFO Atwater, thank you for scheduling
today's hearing so expeditiously. I'm deeply
honored by your endorsement to serve as the
executive director of the Florida Department of
Veterans' Affairs, and I deeply appreciate the
confidence of this Cabinet, and I remain fully
committed to this challenging task of serving the
people of the great state of Florida.

With your support, I am confident we will succeed in delivering the world class support that our brave men and women who have served from World War II to the present conflicts so richly deserve and have earned on the fields of battle, protecting our nation, the greatest nation on the face of Earth.

Thank you for the support. Thank you for allowing me this opportunity to continue my service to the State of Florida. God bless all of you members of the Cabinet. God bless those firefighters' families who gave their life in the line of duty this week. God bless the great state

1 of Florida, and God bless the United States of 2 America. Thank you. 3 GOVERNOR SCOTT: Thank you very much, Colonel Prendergast. Congratulations. And I think all of 4 5 us would say the same thing. Commissioner Putnam's 6 team at Forestry has done an unbelievable job taking 7 care of our wildfires, and it's horrible that we've 8 lost two individuals this week. And this goes along 9 with the six law enforcement officers we've lost 10 this year.

So it — when you talk to the families, there's not much you can say other than you — your prayers go out with them, are with them. It's tough.

So is there any other business to discuss today?

ATTORNEY GENERAL BONDI: No, Governor.

GOVERNOR SCOTT: All right. Thank everybody for calling in. I look forward to seeing you hopefully this week or next week. And we are adjourned. Have a great day.
