# INTRODUCTION SECTION

#### 1) INVITATION

The State of Florida Department of Transportation (hereinafter referred to as the "Department") is soliciting written bids from qualified bidders to establish a contract to provide janitorial services for District Seven headquarters building. It is anticipated that the term of the contract will begin on July 1, 2021 and be effective for three years thereafter.

For the purpose of this document, the term "bidder" means the bidder acting on their own behalf and those individuals, partnerships, firms, or corporations comprising the bidder team. The term "bid package" means the complete response of the bidder to the Invitation to Bid (ITB), including properly completed forms and supporting documentation. After the award, said bidder will be referred to as the "Vendor".

#### 5) DIVERSITY ACHIEVEMENT

#### **MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (MBE) UTILIZATION**

The Department, in accordance with **Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 USC 2000d-2000d-4, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, U.S. Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all bidders that the Department will affirmatively ensure that in any contract/agreement entered into pursuant to this advertisement, minority and disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded the full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in consideration for an award.** 

The Department encourages small, minority, women, and service-disabled veteran businesses to compete for Department contracts, both as "Vendor" and as subcontractors. The Department, its vendors, suppliers, and consultants should take all necessary and reasonable steps to ensure that small, minority, women, and service-disabled veteran businesses have the opportunity to compete for and perform contract work for the Department in a nondiscriminatory environment. Bidders are requested to indicate their intention regarding MBE participation on the MBE Planned Utilization form and to submit the completed form with their bid sheet. #### 6) <u>SCOPE OF SERVICES</u>

Details of the services, information and items to be furnished by the Vendor are described in Exhibits "A", Scope of Services, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

#### 7) INTENDED AWARD

The Department intends to award this contract to the responsive and responsible bidder that submits the lowest responsive bid. If the Department is confronted with identical pricing or scoring from multiple vendors, the Department shall determine the order of award using the following criteria, in the order of preference listed below (from highest priority to lowest priority):

- 1. Section 295.187(4), F.S.; Veteran Business Enterprise
- 2. Section 287.087, F.S.; Drug Free Workplace
- 3. Section 287.057(11); Minority Business Enterprise

In the event that the application of the above referenced preferences does not resolve the identical replies, the Department shall determine the award by means of random drawing.

#### 8) MANDATORY PRE-BID CONFERENCE

# NOTE: MAXIMUM TWO REPRESENTATIVES PER VENDOR. SOCIAL DISTANCING AND MASKS REQUIRED.

A MANDATORY pre-bid conference will be held at the date, time and location in the Timeline. The purpose of this meeting is to provide an open forum for the Department to review the scope of services and respond to questions from potential bidders regarding the scope of services, ITB requirements, contractual requirements, method of compensation, and other conditions or requirements that may, in any manner, affect the work to be performed. Any changes and/or resulting Addenda to the ITB will be the sole prerogative of the Department.

<u>Attendance at this pre-bid conference is MANDATORY</u>. Failure by a bidder to attend or be represented at this pre-bid conference will constitute a non-responsive determination of their bid package. Bids found to be non-responsive will not be considered.

## 9) QUALIFICATIONS

#### 9.1 <u>GENERAL</u>

Bidder must meet the following minimum qualifications:

- 9.1.1 Been actively engaged in the type of business being requested for a minimum of seven years.
- 9.1.2 Bidder shall have performed janitorial cleaning services with a similar scope of services in

a minimum of two other facilities in excess of 115,000 square feet in the last five years. These should be listed in your references.

#### 9.2 BIDDER QUALIFICATIONS

When submitting the bid, each bidder must submit a written statement ("Minimum Qualifications Statement" form), detailing their qualifications that demonstrate they meet the minimum qualifications contained in Special Condition 9.1.1 and 9.1.2. Failure by the bidder to provide the above item(s) will constitute a non-responsive determination. Bids found to be non-responsive will not be considered.

#### 9.3 AUTHORIZED TO DO BUSINESS IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA

In accordance with sections 607.1501, 605.0211(2)(b), and 620.9102, F.S., out of state corporations, out of state limited liability companies, and out of state limited partnerships must be authorized to do business in the State of Florida. Such authorization should be obtained by the bid due date and time, but in any case, must be obtained prior to posting of the intended award of the contract. For authorization, contact:

#### 9.4 LICENSE TO CONDUCT SERVICES IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA

If the services being provided requires that individuals be licensed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, such licenses should be obtained by the bid due date and time, but in any case, must be obtained prior to posting of the intended award of the contract. #### 10) WARRANTY/SUBSTITUTIONS

When performance of the services requires the supply of commodities, a warranty is required on all items provided against defective materials, workmanship, and failure to perform in accordance with required industry performance criteria, for a period of not less than 90 days from the date of acceptance by the purchaser. Any deviation from this criterion must be documented in the bid response or the above statement shall prevail. Delivery of substitute commodities requires prior written approval from the ordering location.

Replacement of all materials found defective within the warranty period shall be made without cost to the purchaser, including transportation if applicable. All fees associated with restocking cancelled orders shall be the responsibility of the vendor.

All items provided during the performance of the contract found to be poorly manufactured will not be accepted, but returned to the vendor, at their expense, for replacement. Replacement of all items found defective shall be made without cost to the Department, including transportation, if applicable. As it may be impossible for each facility to inspect all items upon arrival, a reasonable opportunity must be given to these facilities for inspection of the items and returning those that are defective.

#### 11) LIABILITY INSURANCE

The Vendor shall not commence any work until they have obtained the following types of insurance, and certificates of such insurance have been received by the Department. Nor shall the Vendor allow any subcontractor to commence work on this project until all similar insurance required of the subcontractor has been so obtained. The Vendor shall submit the required Certificates of Insurance (COI) to the Florida Department of Transportation, Procurement Office, MS 7-700, Enrique Garcia, Purchasing Agent, enrique.garcia@dot.state.fl.us, 11201 North McKinley Drive, Tampa, Florida 33612-6456 within 10 days after the ending date of the period for posting the intended award decision.

The Vendor must carry and keep in force during the period of this contract a general liability insurance policy or policies with a company authorized to do business in the State of Florida, affording public liability insurance with combined bodily injury limits of at least \$200,000.00 minimum per person and \$300,000.00 minimum each occurrence, and property damage insurance of at least \$200,000.00 minimum each occurrence, for the services to be rendered in accordance with this contract.

With respect to any general liability insurance policy required pursuant to this agreement, all such policies shall be issued by companies licensed to do business in the State of Florida. The Vendor shall provide to the Department certificates showing the required coverage to be in effect with endorsements showing the Department to be an additional insured prior to commencing any work under this contract. The certificates and policies shall provide that in the event of any material change in or cancellation of the policies reflecting the required coverage, 30 days advance notice shall be given to the Department or as provided in accordance with Florida law.

The Department shall be exempt from, and in no way liable for, any sums of money which may represent a deductible in any insurance policy. The payment of such deductible shall be the sole responsibility of the Vendor or subcontractor providing such insurance. Policies that include Self Insured Retention (SIR) will not be accepted.

#### 12) PERFORMANCE BOND

A Performance Bond is not required for this project.

#### 13) METHOD OF COMPENSATION

Details of the method of compensation are described in Exhibit "B", Method of Compensation, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

#### 14) <u>CONTRACT DOCUMENT</u>

#### STANDARD WRITTEN AGREEMENT

The Department's "Standard Written Agreement" is attached hereto and made a part hereof. The terms and conditions contained therein will become an integral part of the contract resulting from

this solicitation. In submitting a bid, the bidder agrees to be legally bound by these terms and conditions.

## 15) <u>REVIEW OF BIDDER'S FACILITIES AND QUALIFICATIONS</u>

After the bid due date and prior to contract execution, the Department reserves the right to perform or to have performed, an on-site review of the bidder's facilities and qualifications. This review will serve to verify data and representations submitted by the bidder and may be used to determine whether the bidder has adequate facilities, equipment, qualified and experienced staff, and overall management capabilities to provide the required services. The review may also serve to verify whether the bidder has financial capabilities adequate to meet the contract requirements.

**Should** the Department determine that the bid package has material misrepresentations or that the size or nature of the bidder's facilities, equipment, management capabilities, or the number of experienced personnel (including technical staff) are not adequate to ensure satisfactory contract performance, the Department has the right to reject the bid.

## 16) PROTEST OF ITB SPECIFICATIONS

Any person who is adversely affected by the contents of this ITB must file the following with the Department of Transportation, Clerk of Agency Proceedings, Office of the General Counsel, 605 Suwannee Street, Mail Station 58, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0450:

- 1. A written notice of protest within 72 hours after the posting of the solicitation, the notice of protest may be faxed to (850) 414-5264, and
- 2. A formal written protest in compliance with Section 120.57(3), F.S., within 10 days of the date on which the written notice of protest is filed.

Failure to file a protest within the time prescribed in section 120.57(3), F.S., or failure to post the bond or other security required by law within the time allowed for filing a bond shall constitute a waiver of proceedings under Chapter 120, F.S.

#### 17) UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS

The employment of unauthorized aliens by any contractor is considered a violation of Section 274A(e) of the Immigration and Nationality Act. If the contractor knowingly employs unauthorized aliens, such violation shall be cause for unilateral cancellation of the contract.

## 18) SCRUTINIZED COMPANIES LISTS

ALL Responses, regardless of dollar value, must include a completed <u>Vendor Certification</u> <u>Regarding Scrutinized Companies Lists</u> to certify the respondent is not on either of those lists. The form should be submitted with the price proposal.

A Vendor is ineligible to enter into a contract with the Department for goods or services of any amount if, at the time of entering into such contract, the Vendor is on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List, created pursuant to Section 215.4725, F.S., or is engaged in a boycott of Israel.

Section 287.135, F.S., also prohibits companies from entering into a contract for goods or services of \$1 million or more that are on either the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector Lists which were created pursuant to s. 215.473, F.S.

If the Department determines the Vendor submitted a false certification under Section 287.135 of the F.S., the Department shall either terminate the contract after it has given the Vendor notice and an opportunity to demonstrate the Department's determination of false certification was in error pursuant to Section 287.135 of the F.S. or maintain the contract if the conditions of Section 287.135 of the F.S. are met.

#### 19) <u>RESERVATIONS</u>

The Department reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids received and reserves the right to make an award without further discussion of the bids submitted. Therefore, the bidder should make sure that the bid package submitted is complete and accurate and submitted to ensure delivery on or before the bid opening time and date specified in this solicitation. It is understood that the bid will become a part of the Department's official file, without obligation to the Department.

## 20) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

No conditions may be applied to any aspect of the ITB by the bidder. Any conditions placed on any aspect of the bid documents by the bidder may result in the bid being rejected as a conditional bid (see "RESPONSIVENESS OF BIDS"). **DO NOT WRITE IN CHANGES ON ANY ITB SHEET.** The only recognized changes to the ITB prior to bid opening will be a written Addenda issued by the Department.

## 21) <u>RESPONSIVENESS OF BIDS</u>

Bids will not be considered if not received by the Department **on or before** the date and time specified as the due date for submission. All bids must be typed or printed in ink. A responsive bid is an offer to provide the services specified in this ITB in accordance with all requirements of this ITB. Bids found to be non-responsive will not be considered. Bids may be rejected if found to be irregular or not in conformance with the requirements and instructions herein contained. A bid may be found to be irregular or non-responsive by reasons that include, but are not limited to, failure to utilize or complete prescribed forms, modifying the bid requirements, submitting conditional bids or incomplete bids, submitting indefinite or ambiguous bids, or executing forms or the bid sheet with improper and/or undated signatures. Other conditions which may cause rejection of bids include, evidence of collusion among bidders, obvious lack of experience or expertise to provide the required services, and failure to perform or meet financial obligations on previous contracts. ALL determinations of responsiveness will be the responsibility of the FDOT Procurement Office.

## 22) BID SHEET

The bidder must use the attached bid sheet to submit its bid. The bid sheet must be signed and dated in ink by a representative who is authorized to contractually bind the bidder. All bid sheets and other documentation submitted in response to this solicitation must be executed and submitted in accordance with Introduction Section No.3, Electronic Submissions of Bids.

#### 23) ESTIMATED QUANTITIES

The Department anticipates purchasing the estimated quantities shown on the bid sheet, for a three-year period of any contracts resulting from this bid. The estimated quantities are given only as a guideline for preparing your bid and should not be construed as representing the actual quantities to be authorized under this contract. The Vendor(s) shall supply, at bid prices, the actual quantities authorized regardless of whether the total of such quantities is more or less than anticipated. This bid and the resulting contracts will be subject to annual appropriated funding.

#### 24) "DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE" PREFERENCE

Whenever two or more bids which are equal with respect to price, quality, and service are received, the Department shall determine the order of award first in accordance with section 295.187(4), F.S., giving preference to "Veteran Business Enterprise" then to bid responses from vendors that certify the business has implemented a drug-free workplace program in accordance with Section 287.087, F.S. The "Drug-Free Workplace Program Certification" must be completed and submitted with the bid response to be eligible for this preference.

## 25) COPYRIGHTED MATERIAL

Copyrighted material will be accepted as part of a bid only if accompanied by a waiver that will allow the Department to make paper and electronic copies necessary for the use of Department staff and agents. It is noted that copyrighted material is not exempt from the Public Records Law, Chapter 119, F.S. Therefore, such material will be subject to viewing by the public, but copies of the material will not be provided to the public.

## 26) ATTACHMENT TO ITB SUBMITTAL - CONFIDENTIAL MATERIAL

#### EXHIBIT "A"

#### SCOPE OF SERVICES

#### JANITORIAL SERVICES FOR DISTRICT SEVEN HEADQUARTERS BUILDING

#### I. <u>OBJECTIVE</u>

Provide janitorial services for the Florida Department of Transportation, District Seven Headquarters Building, hereinafter referred to as the "Department", located at 11201 North McKinley Drive, Tampa, Florida, in such a manner as to assure the facilities are maintained in a clean, attractive, and sanitary condition. This building consists of 115,200 square feet (sq. ft.) of which 97,010 sq. ft. is carpeted flooring, 4,484 sq. ft is vinyl composite tile (VCT) flooring, 7,420 sq. ft. is luxury vinyl tile (LVT) flooring, 5,386 sq. ft. is porcelain/ceramic flooring tile, and 900 sq. ft. is concrete (mechanical and electrical rooms). The building also consists of 452 windows, two glass single doors and four glass double doors. The restrooms include 30 toilets and seven urinals.

#### II. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE VENDOR

The Vendor shall furnish all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation, and supplies needed (except those provided by the Department as listed in Section VII, Paragraph B, of this scope of services) to perform the following services to the satisfaction of the Department's Contract Manager. These supplies include but are not limited to, liquid soap, tri-fold paper towels, toilet tissue, toilet seat covers and urinal screens. The Vendor shall store all materials, equipment, tools, and supplies needed to perform the services in the storage rooms assigned by the Department's Contract Manager.

Below is an estimate of usage per month:

- 1. Foaming hand soap One to two gallons per month.
- 2. Regular hand soap Four gallons per month.
- 3. Trifold paper towels Twenty-eight cases per month (16 packs per case)
- 4. Toilet tissue small roll Eight cases per month (96 rolls per case)
- 5. Toilet tissue big roll Two cases per month (six per case)
- 6. Toilet seat covers Ten cases per month (20 packs per case)
- 7. Urinal screens One case per month (12 screens in a case)

All Vendor supplied cleaning materials and supplies require approval by the Department's Contract Manager prior to use within the facility. A Safety Data Sheet for each such material must be filed with the Department's Contract Manager and located in the designated janitorial locker.

- **A.** Provide the following janitorial services daily (Monday through Friday):
  - Empty all wastebaskets and replace liners whenever any soiling is visible. Remove all waste materials, including cardboard and packing materials, and place in designated container(s). All large cardboard containers shall be reduced in size by disassembly and flattening prior to being placed in designated refuse container(s).
  - 2. Clean and disinfect all drinking fountains.
  - 3. Clean and vacuum the entire District Secretary's suite to include the restroom and the additional office areas in the suite.
  - 4. Clean and vacuum each of the three Directors offices, the Mail Room, Document Management Center, and the Office Information Technology (OIT) offices. These offices shall be cleaned by the Day Porter during normal business hours; see Section II.H.
  - 5. Clean all restrooms: Mop floors with approved disinfectant solution using a fresh solution mixture for each restroom. Floors shall be clean of all dirt, debris, mildew, and stains. Brush clean urinals and toilets with an approved antiseptic solution using a fresh solution mixture for each restroom. Scrub washbasins and adjacent counters and fixtures with an approved disinfectant solution. Wipe and disinfect toilet seats with an approved disinfectant. Spot clean doors and walls using an approved disinfectant and mildew retardant solution. Clean and polish chrome fittings. Remove any spots, stains, and splashes from walls adjacent to washbasins and showers. Clean and disinfect showers assuring that all soap residue is removed from shower walls and that shower curtains are free of mildew and soap residue. Clean the mirrors. Replenish soap, paper towels, and toilet tissue from vendor stock.
  - 6. Clean and disinfect all snack bar/break room fixtures and surfaces to include ice machine, sinks, cabinets and counter tops. Clean all tables, table legs and chairs. All snack bar/break room surfaces shall be cleaned with an approved disinfectant solution and shall be free of food particles, dirt, and scum. Empty trash containers and replace plastic liners using clear/natural liners. LVT floor to be damp mopped with water or approved solution only. No stripping or waxing of LVT is permitted. If buffing is needed, a white bonnet must be used.
  - 7. Sweep patio, clean patio tables and chairs, and empty waste containers. Wash/disinfect/deodorize waste containers using an approved disinfectant solution.

- 8. Dust and clean all horizontal surfaces below seven feet to include top of door frames ensuring that all office and work areas are free of dust and debris.
- 9. Dust and polish all wood surfaces of lobby and receptionist furniture with a product that does not leave the surfaces greasy.
- 10. Clean glass entrance doors for all entrances. Spot clean interior doors, frames, and wall surfaces.
- 11. Police the grounds surrounding the building and pick up any waste. Empty and clean exterior refuse cans and ashtrays.
- 12. Keep all janitorial closets neat and clean. Empty mop buckets and remove any waste material.
- 13. Turn off lights and check that door(s) are shut and properly secured when finished cleaning an area. Notify the Contract Manager of any building security problems.
- 14. Vacuum all hallways, conference rooms, traffic ways and common areas within work areas. Vacuum or sweep any other carpeted area that has visible dirt or debris in a concentration to be unsightly. Vacuum all areas that contain debris created or caused by cleaning personnel.
- 15. Sweep/dust/mop all non-carpeted floors (except for the 900 sq. ft. of concrete floors in the mechanical and electrical rooms).
- 16. Remove soiled spots from the carpeting using an approved solution. Spot cleaning shall be accomplished during non-business hours (6:00p.m. to 7:00a.m. daily during the week and from 6:00p.m. Friday to 7:00a.m. Monday during the weekend) to preclude increased soiling of wet carpet in high traffic areas.
- 17. Thoroughly dust, scrub, mop and/or buff lobby/receptionist floor using an approved disinfectant/cleansing solution as required to maintain a clean and neat appearance.
- **B.** Provide the following janitorial services weekly:
  - 1. Dust and clean all accessible furniture (desks, file cabinets, chairs, tables, counters, etc.) in offices and common areas ensuring that surfaces are free from dirt and debris.
  - 2. Dust all ledges, sills, and bookcases. Check for and remove any cobwebs.

- 3. Clean all restroom tile walls with an approved disinfectant/mildew inhibiting solution to remove all dirt and debris.
- 5. Clean all restroom stall walls and doors with an approved disinfectant solution to remove all dirt and debris.
- 6. Thoroughly vacuum all carpeted individual work areas.
- 7. Mop and thoroughly clean all porcelain/ceramic tile areas, removing all dirt, debris, and foreign material.
- **C.** Provide the following janitorial services monthly:

Thoroughly vacuum all fabric surfaces of lobby and receptionist furniture, including both sides of loose cushions, and clean to remove spots/stains.

- **D.** Provide the following janitorial services quarterly or upon request of the Department:
  - 1. Dust/clean all ceiling vents to remove dust and debris.
  - 2. Clean/shampoo all carpets in halls, common areas, work traffic areas, the District Secretary's suite and the office areas of the Director of Transportation Operations, Director of Transportation Development, and the Transportation Support Manager. Method of cleaning carpet shall be pre-approved by the Contract Manager. Cleaning shall be required to remove all dirt, stains, and soil from the carpet. Repeat cleaning will be required, at Vendor's cost and until carpet is clean, if carpet is not cleaned sufficiently during scheduled cleaning. Maintain carpet-cleaning equipment that is dedicated to this building. Service in locked areas will be coordinated with Facilities Management in advance to arrange for access.
- **E.** Provide the following janitorial services every six months:

Clean exteriors of cubicle partitions.

**F.** Provide the following services at a scheduled time during the first 30 calendar days of the contract start date.

Strip, scrub, wax, and buff all gray VCT flooring; then perform these services as required to maintain a quality shining appearance.

**G.** Provide the following service at a scheduled time during the first 30 calendar days of the contract and, thereafter, in the 7th month of the contract:

Clean/shampoo all carpets in individual work areas and offices. Method of cleaning carpet shall be pre-approved by the Contract Manager. Cleaning shall be required to remove all dirt, stains, and soil from the carpet. Repeat cleaning will be required, at Vendor's cost and until carpet is clean.

- H. Day Porter:
  - 1. The Vendor shall provide a minimum of one Day Porter, or as many needed to satisfactorily perform designated Day Porter janitorial duties from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Duties include but are not limited to servicing the District Secretary's office, Directors suites, Mail Room, Document Management Center, OIT offices, snack bar, patio, restroom cleaning and supplies replenishment, grounds, emergency cleaning, entrance way upkeep, and other tasks agreed to by the Department and Vendor. The individual must be properly uniformed and be presentable for a business environment. The Day Porter(s) must be conversant in English.
  - 2. The duties of the Day Porter are in addition to the services specified in Section II, Paragraph "A" above. The Department's Contract Manager or his designated representative shall direct the activities of the Day Porter.

## III. VENDOR PERSONNEL

- A. The Vendor shall assign an on-site supervisor who is to be conversant in English for the night crew for this contract. The on-site supervisor may be part of the working janitorial crew. A point of contact and a daytime telephone number shall be provided in writing to the Department's Contract Manager prior to the start of this contract. The supervisor is required to be on-site with the non-business hours cleaning crew.
- **B.** The Vendor shall provide janitorial personnel who are qualified, reliable, properly trained, and able to perform the duties and responsibilities required by this contract. The Vendor shall rectify any personnel problems promptly upon notification by the Department.
- **C.** Janitorial personnel must enter and leave from the main entrance and shall badge in when they arrive and badge out when they leave for the day. When working weekends, they must badge in and out and sign in/out in the Visitor log at the front desk.
- **D.** The Vendor shall ensure continuity in personnel assignments so janitorial services are performed by workers familiar with the facility and on-site procedures.
- **E.** All janitorial personnel shall be uniformed with clean, presentable, and easily identifiable uniforms.

**F.** Janitorial personnel shall not smoke during their shift/any work time being paid by the Department, nor shall they have personal visitors or family members at the work site at any time.

## IV. WORK SCHEDULE

- A. The building will be available to the Vendor for after-hours cleaning, which are herein described as 5:00p.m. to 7:00a.m. daily during the week and from 5:00p.m. Friday to 7:00a.m. Monday during the weekend. The following are the paid state holidays when the facility is closed and no services will be needed, however, janitorial staff shall receive their regular pay on these days: New Year's Day, Birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (third Monday in January), Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, Friday after Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day. Historically, about three days per year, there may be occurrences of Agency Head or Governor of Florida mandated facility closures due to weather, extended holidays or other; janitorial staff must receive their regular pay on these mandated facility closures outside of the holiday schedule.
- **B.** The Vendor shall submit its work schedule to the Department's Contract Manager, in writing, within the first 30 days of the contract performance. The work schedule must show specific dates for all periodic services. The scheduled service days shall not be changed without prior coordination with the Department's Contract Manager. The Vendor shall perform all daily and weekly contract requirements upon contract start date.
- **C.** The anticipated work schedule is daily for routine cleaning (Monday through Friday), and weekends as needed, for the term of the contract and/or within available budget.

## V. <u>PERFORMANCE STANDARDS</u>

- **A.** After completion of each scheduled service the buildings shall present a clean, uniform appearance free of cobwebs, dirt, dust, lint, litter, film, stains, streaks, and smudges. There shall be no splash marks or streaks on furniture, walls, and baseboards. If any irregularities are noted, the Vendor shall rectify the situation with no additional costs to the Department.
- **B.** The Vendor shall develop a checklist to ensure all tasks are accomplished and to assist in quality control. The checklist must be made available upon request by the Department's Contract Manager.
- **C.** The service performance will be reviewed by the Department's Contract Manager. The Contract Manager or designee will verify the work is completed by the Vendor. Discrepancies requiring correction will be brought to the

Vendor's attention upon completion. The Vendor shall correct those discrepancies before leaving the premises, unless specifically agreed to by both parties.

#### VI. <u>DAMAGES</u>

Janitorial personnel shall use care to prevent damage to the building and its contents. The Vendor shall be responsible for any damages caused by its employees.

- **A.** The Vendor shall be assessed damages for the below stated reasons. The Department's Contract Manager will provide written notice to the Vendor of assessment of damages. When damages are assessed, they will be deducted from the next invoice submitted for payment.
  - 1. Using unapproved cleaning materials Actual amount of damages.
  - 2. Failure to maintain Department's property in clean condition and good state of repair that results in damage to or dirtying of facility Actual amount of damages.
- **B.** Application of the damages provision will not waive nor limit the Department's right to initiate action under Paragraph 6, Termination and Default, of the Standard Written Agreement.

## VII. <u>DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

- A. The Department shall provide a Contract Manager for administering the terms and conditions of this contract who will be Timothy Bash, District Facilities Supervisor, MS 7-240, 11201 North McKinley Drive, Tampa, Florida 33612-6456. The Department reserves the right to change the Contract Manager at any time.
- **B.** The Department will provide and install spray can deodorizers and dispensers in bathrooms and liquid hand sanitizer and hand sanitizing dispensers throughout the facility.
- **C.** The Department will supply storage for a weekly supply of cleaning supplies.

## VIII. BEGINNING AND LENGTH OF SERVICES

The performance period of this contract will be from July 1, 2021 until June 30, 2024.

## IX. TERMINATION ACTION

Reference is made in Paragraph 6 of the Standard Written Agreement. Any necessary default action will be processed in accordance with Department of General Services Rule 60A-1.006(3).

STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, hereinafter called the "Department" and \_\_\_\_\_\_, of \_\_\_\_\_ duly authorized to conduct business in the State of Florida, hereinafter called "Vendor," hereby agree as follows:

#### 1. <u>SERVICES AND PERFORMANCE</u>

- A In connection with <u>Janitorial Services for District Seven Headquarters Building</u>, the Department does hereby retain the Vendor to furnish certain services, information, and items as described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- B. Before making any additions or deletions to the work described in this Agreement, and before undertaking any changes or revisions to such work, the parties shall negotiate any necessary cost changes and shall enter into an Amendment covering such work and compensation. Reference herein to this Agreement shall include any amendment(s).
- C. All tracings, plans, specifications, maps, computer files, and reports prepared or obtained under this Agreement, as well as all data collected, together with summaries and charts derived therefrom, shall be the exclusive property of the Department without restriction or limitation on their use and shall be made available, upon request, to the Department at any time during the performance of such services and/or upon completion or termination of this Agreement. Upon delivery to the Department of said document(s), the Department shall become the custodian thereof in accordance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Vendor shall not copyright any material and products or patent any invention developed under this Agreement. The Department shall have the right to visit the site for inspection of the work and the products of the Vendor at any time.
- D. All final plans, documents, reports, studies, and other data prepared by the Vendor shall bear the professional's seal/signature, in accordance with the applicable Florida Statutes, Administrative Rules promulgated by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, and guidelines published by the Department, in effect at the time of execution of this Agreement. In the event that changes in the statutes or rules create a conflict with the requirements of published guidelines, requirements of the statutes and rules shall take precedence.
- E. The Vendor agrees to provide project schedule progress reports in a format acceptable to the Department and at intervals established by the Department. The Department shall be entitled at all times to be advised, at its request, as to the status of work being done by the Vendor and of the details thereof. Coordination shall be maintained by the Vendor with representatives of the Department, or of other agencies interested in the project on behalf of the Department. Either party to this Agreement may request and be granted a conference.
- F. All services shall be performed by the Vendor to the satisfaction of the Director who shall decide all questions, difficulties, and disputes of any nature whatsoever that may arise under or by reason of this Agreement, the prosecution and fulfillment of the services hereunder and the character, quality, amount of value thereof; and the decision upon all claims, questions, and disputes shall be final and binding upon the parties hereto. Adjustments of compensation and contract time because of any major changes in the work that may become necessary or desirable as the work progresses shall be subject to mutual agreement of the parties, and amendment(s) shall be entered into by the parties in accordance herewith.

Reference herein to the Director shall mean the Transportation Support Manager.

#### 2. <u>TERM</u>

- A Initial Term. This Agreement shall begin on date of execution and shall remain in full force and effect through completion of all services required or <u>three years</u>, whichever occurs first. Subsequent to the execution of this Agreement by both parties, the services to be rendered by the Vendor shall commence and be completed in accordance with the option selected below. Any renewal or extension must be in writing and is subject to the same terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and any written amendments signed by the parties.
- C. EXTENSIONS. In the event that circumstances arise which make performance by the Vendor impracticable or impossible within the time allowed or which prevent a new contract from being executed, the Department, in its discretion, may grant an extension of this Agreement. Extension of this Agreement must be in writing for a period not to exceed six (6) months and is subject to the same terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and any written amendments signed by the parties; provided the Department may, in its discretion, grant a proportional increase in the total dollar amount based on the method and rate established herein. There may be only one extension of this Agreement is due to events beyond the control of the Vendor.

It shall be the responsibility of the Vendor to ensure at all times that sufficient time remains in the Project Schedule within which to complete services on the project. In the event there have been delays which would affect the project completion date, the Vendor shall submit a written request to the Department which identifies the reason(s) for the delay and the amount of time related to each reason. The Department shall review the request and make a determination as to granting all or part of the requested extension.

#### 3. <u>COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT</u>

A Payment shall be made only after receipt and approval of goods and services unless advance payments are authorized by the Chief Financial Officer of the State of Florida under Chapters 215 and 216, Florida Statutes. If the Department determines that the performance of the Vendor is unsatisfactory, the Department shall notify the Vendor of the deficiency to be corrected, which correction shall be made within a time-frame to be specified by the Department. The Vendor shall, within five days after notice from the Department, provide the Department with a corrective action plan describing how the Vendor will address all issues of contract non-performance, unacceptable performance, failure to meet the minimum performance levels, deliverable deficiencies, or contract non-compliance. If the corrective action plan is unacceptable to the Department, the Vendor shall be assessed a non-performance retainage equivalent to 10% of the total invoice amount. The retainage shall be applied to the invoice for the then-current billing period. The retainage shall be withheld until the vendor resolves the deficiency. If the deficiency is subsequently resolved, the Vendor will bill the Department for the retained amount during the next billing period. If the vendor is unable to resolve the deficiency, the funds retained will be forfeited at the end of the agreement period.

- B. If this Agreement involves units of deliverables, then such units must be received and accepted in writing by the Contract Manager prior to payments.
- C. Bills for fees or other compensation for services or expenses shall be submitted in detail sufficient for a proper preaudit and postaudit thereof.
- D. The bills for any travel expenses, when authorized by terms of this Agreement and by the Department's Project Manager, shall be submitted on the Department's Travel Form No. 300-000-06 and will be paid in accordance with Section 112.061, F.S and the most current version of the Disbursement Handbook for Employees and Managers.
- E. Vendors providing goods and services to the Department should be aware of the following time frames. Upon receipt, the Department has five (5) working days to inspect and approve the goods and services, unless otherwise specified herein. The Department has twenty (20) days to deliver a request for payment (voucher) to the Department of Financial Services. The twenty (20) days are measured from the latter of the date the invoice is received or the goods or services are received, inspected and approved.
- F. If a payment is not available within forty (40) days, a separate interest penalty as established pursuant to Section 215.422, Florida Statutes, shall be due and payable, in addition to the invoice amount, to the Vendor. Interest penalties of less than one (1) dollar shall not be enforced unless the Vendor requests payment. Invoices which have to be returned to a Vendor because of Vendor preparation errors shall result in a delay in the payment. The invoice payment requirements do not start until a properly completed invoice is provided to the Department.
- G. The State of Florida, through the Department of Management Services, has instituted MyFloridaMarketPlace, a statewide eProcurement system. Pursuant to Section 287.057(22), Florida Statutes, all payments shall be assessed a transaction fee of one percent (1%), which the Vendor shall pay to the State. For payments within the State accounting system (FLAIR or its successor), the transaction fee shall, when possible, be automatically deducted from payments to the Vendor. If automatic deduction is not possible, the Vendor shall pay the transaction fee pursuant to Rule 60A-1.031 (2), Florida Administrative Code, By submission of these reports and corresponding payments. Vendor certifies their correctness. All such reports and payments shall be subject to audit by the State or its designee. The Vendor shall receive a credit for any transaction fee paid by the Vendor for the purchase of any item(s) if such item(s) are returned to the Vendor through no fault, act, or omission of the Vendor. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a transaction fee is non-refundable when an item is rejected or returned. or declined, due to the Vendor's failure to perform or comply with specifications or requirements of the Agreement. Failure to comply with these requirements shall constitute grounds for declaring the Vendor in default and recovering reprocurement costs from the Vendor in addition to all outstanding fees. VENDORS DELINQUENT IN PAYING TRANSACTION FEES MAY BE EXCLUDED FROM CONDUCTING FUTURE BUSINESS WITH THE STATE.
- H. A vendor ombudsman has been established within the Department of Financial Services. The duties of this individual include acting as an advocate for vendors who may be experiencing problems in obtaining timely payment(s) from a state agency. - L Records of costs incurred under terms of this Agreement shall be maintained and made available upon request to the Department at all times during the period of this Agreement and for three (3) years after final payment for the work pursuant to this Agreement is made. Copies of these documents and records shall be furnished to the Department upon request. Records of costs incurred shall include the Vendor's general accounting records and the project records, together with supporting documents and records of the Vendor and all subcontractors performing work on the project, and all other records of the Vendor and subcontractors considered necessary by the Department for a proper audit of projectcosts.
- J. The Department, during any fiscal year, shall not expend money, incur any liability, or enter into any contract which, by its terms, involves the expenditure of money in excess of the amounts budgeted as available for expenditure during such fiscal year. #### E. CERTIFICATION.

The Vendor shall provide to the Department certificates showing the required coverage to be in effect with endorsements showing the Department to be an additional insured prior to commencing any work under this Contract. Policies that include Self Insured Retention (SIR) will not be accepted. The certificates and policies shall

provide that in the event of any material change in or cancellation of the policies reflecting the required coverage, thirty days advance notice shall be given to the Department or as provided in accordance with Florida law.

#### 5. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS</u>

- A The Vendor shall comply with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. Specifically, the Vendor shall:
  - (1) Keep and maintain public records required by the Department to perform the service.
  - (2) Upon request from the Department's custodian of public records, provide the Department with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law.
  - (3) Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement term and following completion of the Agreement if the Vendor does not transfer the records to the Department.
  - (4) Upon completion of the Agreement, transfer, at no cost, to the Department, all public records in possession of the Vendor or keep and maintain public records required by the Department to perform the service. If the Vendor transfers all public records to the Department upon completion of the Agreement, the Vendor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Vendor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the Agreement, the Vendor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the Department, upon request from the Department's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the Department.

Failure by the Vendor to comply with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, shall be grounds for immediate unilateral cancellation of this Agreement by the Department.

B. The Vendor agrees that it shall make no statements, press releases or publicity releases concerning this Agreement or its subject matter or otherwise discuss or permit to be disclosed or discussed any of the data or other information obtained or furnished in compliance with this Agreement, or any particulars thereof, during the period of the Agreement, without first notifying the Department's Contract Manager and securing prior written consent. The Vendor also agrees that it shall not publish, copyright, or patent any of the data developed under this Agreement, it being understood that such data or information are works made for hire and the property of the Department.

- C. The Vendor shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work or payment for work thereof, and will not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability in the performance of work under this Agreement.
- D. If the Vendor is licensed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to perform the services herein contracted, then Section 337.162, Florida Statutes, applies as follows:

Except to the extent expressly authorized herein, Vendor and its employees, agents, representatives, or subcontractors are not agents of the Department or the State for any purpose or authority such as to bind or represent the interests thereof, and shall not represent that it is an agent or that it is acting on the behalf of the Department or the State. The Department shall not be bound by any unauthorized acts or conduct of the Vendor or its employees, agents, representatives, or subcontractors. Vendor agrees to include this provision in all its subcontracts under this Agreement.
- B. All words used herein in the singular form shall extend to and include the plural. All words used in the plural form shall extend to and include the singular. All words used in any gender shall extend to and include all genders.
- C. This Agreement embodies the whole agreement of the parties. There are no promises, terms, conditions, or obligations other than those contained herein, and this Agreement shall supersede all previous communications, representations, or agreements, either verbal or written, between the parties hereto. The State of Florida terms and conditions, whether general or specific, shall take precedence over and supersede any inconsistent or conflicting provision in any attached terms and conditions of the Vendor.
- D. It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that if any part, term or provision of this Agreement is by the courts held to be illegal or in conflict with any law of the State of Florida, the validity of the remaining portions or provisions shall not be affected, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the particular part, term, or provision held to be invalid.

- E. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.
- F. In any legal action related to this Agreement, instituted by either party, the Vendor hereby waives any and all privileges and rights it may have under Chapter 47 and Section 337.19, Florida Statutes, relating to venue, as it now exists or may hereafter be amended, and any and all such privileges and rights it may have under any other statute, rule, or case law, including, but not limited to those grounded on convenience. Any such legal action may be brought in the appropriate Court in the county chosen by the Department and in the event that any such legal action is filed by the Vendor, the Vendor hereby consents to the transfer of venue to the county chosen by the Department upon the Department filing a motion requesting the same.
- G. If this Agreement involves the purchase or maintenance of information technology as defined in Section 282.0041, Florida Statutes, the selected provisions of the attached Appendix II are made a part of this Agreement.
- H. If this Agreement is the result of a formal solicitation (Invitation to Bid, Request for Proposal or Invitation to Negotiate), the Department of Management Services Forms PUR1000 and PUR1001, included in the solicitation, are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
- I. The Department may grant the Vendor's employees or subconsultants access to the Department's secure networks as part of the project. In the event such employees' or subconsultants' participation in the project is terminated or will be terminated, the Vendor shall notify the Department's project manager no later than the employees' or subconsultants' separation date from participation in the project or immediately upon the Vendor acquiring knowledge of such termination of employees' or subconsultants' participation in the project, whichever occurs later.
- J. Vendor/Contractor:
  - 1. shall utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the Vendor/Contractor during the term of the contract; and
